## A Word from Pastor Zach Galatians: Transforming Our Lives

Happy summer everyone! The time grows near- on Monday I will point our minivan's wheels west. I hope to arrive by next Friday, and will see many of you on July 12th.

Beginning that Sunday, we will be working through Paul's Letter to the Galatians, which should take us through the rest of the summer. I would encourage all of you to read through the letter a few times in the coming weeks. For any overachievers, Timothy Keller (*Galatians for You*) and N.T. Wright (*Paul for Everyone: Galatians and Thessalonians*) have excellent, but not at all technical commentaries.

In the letter, Paul writes polemically, targeting the circumcision party. We'll get into the details of the dispute, but for now, it boils down to this: the

circumcision party did not believe that Jesus made much of a difference in people's lives. They expected Jesus to function as a sort of forgiveness vending machine, which they could visit on occasion and then go about their business.

Paul vehemently disagreed. He saw Jesus and the Gospel as holistic; transforming every aspect of believers' lives here and now as well as assuring us of our eternal destiny.

So my challenge to us as we read is to ask ourselves the following question: What difference does Jesus make in our lives?

Try to avoid answers that center around church activities (on Thursday evenings I go to a small group), and don't settle for vague answers like 'peace' or 'joy'. Think about the different arenas of your life (work,

friendships, hobbies, family) and the specific ways Jesus affects them. How are you different as an employee, as a husband, as a mother, as a student?

I have found this a hard question to answer. If I am honest, a lot of the time Jesus doesn't make that much of a difference. I come to church on Sundays, I read the Bible, I pray a bit, and I go about my business. And that uncomfortable reality makes me think I am actually much closer to the circumcision party than I would like to be.

My hope and prayer for us as we study this letter is we would better understand Jesus as Paul did, and that we would be made new. I pray that if anyone were to ask any of us 'what difference does Jesus actually make?' our honest answer would be 'let me tell you; more and more every day.'
