Craig's Corner A New Season is upon Us

Summer is coming to a close in a few weeks and fall will be upon us. For me, fall has always been a time of year where things start fresh. School begins, football season gets into full swing and the fall air says nature is preparing for winter. I have also discovered that this time of year can be a fruitful time if we will stop long enough to reflect and make decisions on how the rhythm of daily living is going to be set, not on our own terms, but by submitting to God's will.

As followers of Jesus, I want to encourage us to not let the busyness of leaving summer and entering into fall be done without spending some time seeking the Lord for what He wants us to do in the coming days. In Ephesians 5:15-18, Paul says, "See then that you walk carefully, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what

the will of the Lord is. And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation, but be filled with the Spirit."

These wise words are a wonderful reminder that we should not rush into life without seeking counsel, direction, and guidance from the Lord. The Bible has many stories where those who sought God found success, and those who did not seek counsel from God found disappointment.

There is a common thread to the 4 phrases above that are highlighted they are all imperatives. When Paul says, walk carefully, it carries the idea of using precision and accuracy. The opposite of this would be to live carelessly and haphazardly. The second imperative Paul gives is to redeem the time, or take advantage of the opportunities God places before you. If we don't live carefully, redeeming the time, we may look back and wonder, "How did I waste my life?"

The third imperative is to *understand* what the will of the Lord is.

Understanding suggests using our minds to discover and do the will of God. As we meditate on God and His Word over time, we gain the mind of Christ and are better equipped to discover God's will. The fourth imperative is to **be filled with the Spirit.** The verb "to be filled" means to continue being filled, so it is intended to be an ongoing experience we should enjoy. To be filled also means to be "controlled by." When our lives are surrendered to God we find the most fulfillment, because we are living our lives the way God has intended.

I hope we will all spend time taking to heart Paul's words from Ephesians 5 as we enter the fall season. Why not set time aside in the next week or so and take your Bible and a notepad and spend time with God seeking Him. You may find that you are pleasantly surprised by His joy.

Calvin Financial Update

It's always difficult to report on church finances in the midst of the year because the expenses are not apportioned exactly 1/12th each month, although our largest expense category – staff compensation – is close. The receipt of contributions follows this same path. It's not unusual for our monthly financial reports to indicate a significant deficit with the deficit being covered in December.

The good news as of June 2015 is that both our revenue AND expenses are running less than the budget, resulting in a small positive net revenue, although member of Session, would be happy the positive number was used up in

\$123,527 and our expenses totaled \$116,503. Although this is good news, please keep in mind that the giving always drops off during the summer months. If the revenue had equaled the budget, the revenue would have been \$23,000 higher.

For many years Calvin has pledged to donate 10% of its budget to other charitable organizations. That obligation is a consistent amount each month of approximately \$1,280.

Women's Bible Study


Tuesdays, 1-2:30 p.m.
