Uganda 2018 August 1-16



Yes, once again a group of Calvin folks are off to Uganda! Judy Kraft, Callie Newton and Vanessa Washburn will be the team for this trip,

bringing a variety of talents and experiences to our friends in Africa.

Judy will be reviewing the records for the Asante Program and developing, with the Uganda staff, plans for the future. Friends of the Family are sharing their healthy relationships materials that Judy will discuss with the older youth.

Vanessa will be working with the children at Lighthouse School; teaching and



getting acquainted, guiding them in their lives as children of God. Callie will be recording what we see and do so that we can bring back video images for you to enjoy and for use in recruiting others to help. We will also be visiting homes, ministering to the women, and presenting a video series on marriage to couples. As always, these plans are held lightly so that we can be sensitive to God's purposes for this trip.

We need your help to make all this possible. Each of the team members are contributing what they can to the trip, but the expenses (\$6000) are more than we can supply. Please pray about what God would have you give to this effort. To date, \$4660 has been received.

Latvia 2018 July 23-27

This marks the fifth year that Calvin will send teachers to lead English camp in Madona, Latvia and continues a more-than 20-year history of serving the Lord and building relationships in Latvia. This camp is in association with Eagle's Wings, a mercy ministry of Philomath-based Bridge Builders International.

This year's team is: Marc, Carol and Katie Andresen; Skip and Laura Rung; Janae Miller, Callie Newton, and Sarah Munoz of Corvallis First Baptist Church. The group will teach practical

English classes twice per day to about 30 campers. This year's camp theme is the cardinal virtues and fruit of the Spirit.



There are few opportunities like this in Latvia. Children - most of whom come from poor and broken homes - spend most of their summer inside on screens. English camp not only facilitates learning, but a connection to their local church youth group and opportunity to hear the gospel.

For thousands of years, the Psalms have been the prayer book of the church. In Dietrich Bonhoeffer's words, they are God's extended answer to the disciples' request, "teach us how to pray," as we learn through them how to relate to God in every season. In success and in failure, in peaceful times and in times of tumult, they show us how to bring our full selves before the Lord and how he is present and active in each of these situations. Due to the length of the book, we will only have time to cover a selection of the Psalms, but our hope is that we have selected a broad enough sampling that we will at least be introduced to the main ideas of the book. We look forward to studying this book with you and hearing what God has to say to us through it!
