Lent at Calvin

March 6 marks the beginning of the season of Lent, during which we fast and reflect in preparation for celebrating Jesus' resurrection. We will begin this season as we did last year with a series of gatherings, listed below. Our purpose for these gatherings, and for the season of Lent as a whole, remains "pull a weed, plant a tree", from Psalm 1 and Jesus' parable of the sower in Mark 4, especially 4:18-20.

In fasting, we set aside things which occupy space in our lives, space that could be more fruitful if occupied by God. We set aside those things, not for the sake of testing our endurance, but in the hope that God will come to occupy that space. Fasting information and guidelines that we shared last year are on the entry table at church.

Calvin and Oakville Pres. will gather at Camp Attitude Friday 4/5—Sunday 4/7. The program includes meals, games and three teaching sessions.
